Dear Santa-I am in the fourth grade and like my teacher. Please bring me an air rifle, pair of riding pants, shirt and a pair of gloves or anything you think I can use. I'd like some fruit, nuts and candy. Please remember all of my friends and poor children. Your friend, Herman Herbert Hopkins, Krum. P.S.-I'd like a ball and mitt.

December 22, 1937

Dear Santa Claus- How are you? I am a little girl 8 years old. I go to Plainview school. I don't want much. Will you bring Jimmie Roy something? I want a piano and a pencil set and a new coat. Bye-Bye Santa. Don't forget us little children. Virginia Katherine Higgs, Krum.

Dear Santa Claus- How are you? Please bring me a little bill fold and a pedal car, and don't forget Charles and Wallace and Dorothy Mae and daddy and mother. Bring us some fruit and nuts and candy and don't forget my teacher. I am in the third grade. Your friend, Billy Jack Hudgins, Krum.

Dear Santa Claus-Christmas time is almost here. I do not want much, but I want a new raincoat and lots of fruit, candy and nuts. Please remember my little brothers and sisters. They want some candy and nuts. My little sister wants a coat and my little brother 3 years old wants a train. Your friend, Doris Collier, Krum.
